Bulk Shipping Program

Once a month between March and September, members may order beekeeping supplies from Tisdale Bee Outfitters to save on shipping costs. Please note: Beemaid will bring down any ordered/prepaid supplies to the Annual General Meeting on the second Saturday of March, without transportation charges.

How it works:

1. Members contact Beemaid (Tisdale) at **306-873-2521** to place an order and complete payment for any products ordered.
2. Beemaid bundles all of the Regina and District Bee Club orders onto one or more pallets and arranges to ship them to Regina.
3. **On the third Friday of the month, between 5-6:00 p.m., Bee Club members go to Manitoulin Transport, located at 385 Henderson Drive in Regina, to collect orders.**
4. The Program Coordinator accepts the shipment and allocates final shipping charges, based on the actual weight of each order to each person ordering that month.
 - *For example, someone ordering an extractor and supers may pay \$50 and someone receiving an envelope of candlewick may pay 20 cents.*
5. Bee Club members pay the Program Co-ordinator the allocated shipping costs by cheque, or cash. An e-transfer (ilovebees@reginabeeclub.ca) is also acceptable with proof of the completed transaction shown to the Program Co-ordinator. Then, the supply order and a copy of their Beemaid invoice is released.

It is your responsibility to pick your stuff up

If a Bee Club Member cannot pick up their order on the scheduled date, it is their responsibility to delay their order until the following month, to ask a friend to pick up the order on their behalf, or to have their order shipped separately.

To claim any item not picked up on the scheduled date, a **\$50 inconvenience fee** will be charged and must be paid to the Program Coordinator when the order is picked up. If it is necessary to make alternate arrangements, **text Celine at 306-530-7978 before 6:00 p.m. on the pickup date.** It is your responsibility to track her down – not her responsibility to find you.

Any items not collected by September 30th of the bee season will become the property of the Regina and District Bee Club and will be raffled off at the next Annual General Meeting.
